At a regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Brighton, Monroe County, New

York, duly held at Town Hall, 2300 Elmwood Avenue, Rochester, New York 14618 on March 8.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF BRIGHTON, MONROE COUNTY, NEW YORK (THE "TOWN"), AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$23,000 IN SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN TO FINANCE THE COST OF ACQUIRING AND CONSTRUCTING THE IMPROVEMENTS CONSTITUTING THE TOWN OF BRIGHTON SUSQUEHANNA ROAD & NORTHUMBERLAND ROAD DRAINAGE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, by resolution of the Town Board of the of the Town of Brighton, Monroe County, New York (the "Town") dated March 8, 2017, adopted immediately prior to the consideration of this resolution, said Town Board adopted its final order establishing the Town of Brighton Susquehanna Road & Northumberland Road Drainage District (the "District") in accordance with Article 12-A of the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted May 25, 2016, the Town Board of the Town (the "Town Board") determined that establishment of the District and the acquisition and construction of the improvements to be included therein (a) constituted an "Unlisted Action" within the meaning of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, and the regulations thereunder (collectively, "SEQRA") and (b) would not have an adverse environmental impact and adopted a negative declaration with respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board now wishes to appropriate funds and to authorize the issuance of obligations of the Town to finance said District and the improvements therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF BRIGHTON, MONROE COUNTY, NEW YORK HEREBY RESOLVES (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of such body), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Town is hereby authorized to issue up to \$23,000 principal amount of serial bonds (including, without limitation, statutory installment bonds) pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law") to finance the estimated cost of acquiring, constructing and

equipping the improvements to be included in the District, including the acquisition of land and/or easements or other rights therein, and the construction of improvements consisting of sewer mains, lateral lines, interconnection appurtenances, road borings, manholes, force mains, valves, pumps, curb stops, original furnishings, equipment, machinery or apparatus, fill, services, including, without limitation, the installation of approximately 430 feet of 12-inch HDPE storm sewer, along with six (6) storm inlets, connecting to the existing storm sewer along Brooklawn Drive in the Town, and all other appurtenant and incidental improvements necessary or appropriate to serve benefited properties within said sewer district, all engineering and other preliminary costs, legal expenses and other costs incidental to the financing thereof (collectively, the "Project").

SECTION 2. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforementioned specific object or purpose is \$23,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan for the financing thereof shall consist of (i) the issuance of \$23,000 in serial bonds of the Town authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 1 of this resolution, and bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation thereof, (ii) the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon benefited properties within the District; and (iii) to the extent necessary, the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness for the aforementioned specific object or purpose is forty (40) years, pursuant to subdivision 4. of paragraph a. of Section 11.00 of the Law.

SECTION 4. The final maturity of the bonds herein authorized to be issued pursuant to Section 1 of this resolution shall be in excess of five (5) years measured from the date of issuance of the first serial bond or bond anticipation note issued.

SECTION 5. The temporary use of available funds of the Town, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law, for the capital purposes described in this resolution. The Town shall reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by Section 1 of this resolution. This resolution shall constitute a declaration of "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized by Section 1 hereof with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 6. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the Town without legal or constitutional limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal and interest on said serial bonds and

SECTION 10. The Town Supervisor is further authorized to enter into continuing disclosure undertakings with or for the benefit of the initial purchaser of the bonds or notes in compliance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

SECTION 11. The intent of this resolution is to give the Town Supervisor sufficient authority to execute those applications, agreements and instruments, or to do any similar acts necessary to affect the issuance of the aforesaid serial bonds or bond anticipation notes without resorting to further action of this Town Board.

SECTION 12. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money; or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

SECTION 13. This resolution shall take effect immediately and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a copy of this resolution, or a summary thereof, to be published, together with a notice attached in substantially the form as prescribed in Section 81.00 of the Law, in the official newspaper(s) of the Town for such purpose.

The specific object or purpose for which the bonds are authorized is to finance the estimated cost of acquiring, constructing and equipping the improvements to be included in the Town of Brighton Susquehanna Road & Northumberland Road Drainage District, including the acquisition of land and/or easements or other rights therein, and the construction of improvements consisting of sewer mains, lateral lines, interconnection appurtenances, road borings, manholes, force mains, valves, pumps, curb stops, original furnishings, equipment, machinery or apparatus, fill, services, including, without limitation, the installation of approximately 430 feet of 12-inch HDPE storm sewer, along with six (6) storm inlets, connecting to the existing storm sewer along Brooklawn Drive in the Town, and all other appurtenant and incidental improvements necessary or appropriate to serve benefited properties within said sewer district, all engineering and other preliminary costs, legal expenses and other costs incidental to the financing thereof,.
