Brighton Supervisor Issues 2nd Emergency Order to Support Social Distancing

Brighton Town Supervisor William W. Moehle issued an Emergency Order today extending for another five days parking prohibitions along certain streets near Corbett's Glen Nature Park and expanding the "no parking" areas to include all of Glen Rd. instead of a portion. The Order also extends the closure of the Corbett's Glen parking lot and prohibition of garage sales. This action has been taken to support social distancing required during the COVID-19 health emergency.

Corbett's Glen has experienced an extraordinary increase in usage and has narrow trails. The parking restrictions will help decrease user density and promote social distancing. The parking lot at Corbett's Glen remains closed and parking is prohibited at all times on the following streets in the Town of Brighton:

Inwood Dr.	Both	Penfield Rd. to Stoneham Rd.

Garage sales are also prohibited as they promote social congregation at a time when social distance is extremely important to help reduce the number of people exposed to COVID-19.

There are no parking changes at other Town parks.

Emergency Order 2020.02 follows.

TOWN OF BRIGHTON EMERGENCY ORDER 2020.02

Dated: April 14, 2020

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, I declared a State of Emergency in the Town of Brighton, pursuant to Article 2-B of the Executive Law of the State of New York, due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2020, I issued Town of Brighton Emergency Order 2020.01, concerning parking restrictions and closures as well as the prohibition of garage sales in the Town of Brighton; and

WHEREAS, Section 24(1) of the Executive Law of the State of New York authorizes the issuance of emergency orders to protect life and property or to bring the emergency situation under control; and

WHEREAS, the conditions that led to the declaration of the State of Emergency in the Town of Brighton and the issuance of Emergency Order 2020.01 remain in effect, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and therefore the Emergency Order 2020.01 should be extended as provided by the Executive Law of the State of New York and expanded to address additional issues as set forth herein

NOW, THEREFORE, I, William W. Moehle, Supervisor of the Town of Brighton, do hereby extend Emergency Order 2020.01 for an additional five (5) days, through April 19, 2020, in all respects; and

I FURTHER ORDER, that that portion of Executive Order 2020.01 relating to parking on specific streets be modified to read in its entirety as follows, prohibiting parking at all times on the following streets in the Town of Brighton:

Avon Dr.	Both	Forest Hills Dr. to Beverly Dr.
Dale Rd.	Both	Dale Rd. East to and including cul de sac
Forest Hills Rd.	Both	Penfield Rd. to Beverly Dr.
Glen Rd.	Both	Entire length
Inwood Dr.	Both	Penfield Rd. to Stoneham Rd.

These provisions shall continue to supersede any existing inconsistent parking restrictions on any of these streets under Section 185-46 or 185-49 of the Brighton Town Code.
